




HA LONG BAY




HO CHI MINH CITY


NHA TRANG


DA LAT

5 DON'T SHOW AFFECTION IN PUBLIC



Save hugs and kisses for behind closed doors to not offend the Vietnamese.

Request permission before snapping pictures of local people.

ELECTRICITY

In Vietnam, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type A, type C and type D are used. The standard voltage is 110 / 220 V at a frequency of 50 Hz.







CURRENCY

Vietnamese Dong (VND) is the official currency of Vietnam.

ATMs: You can find ATMs in most cities and major towns. Look for ATMs with international networks like Visa, MasterCard, or Cirrus. Major banks in Vietnam like Vietcombank, VietinBank, and BIDV often have reliable ATMs.

MAJOR NATIONAL HOLIDAY

TẾT NGUYÊN ĐÁN LUNAR NEW YEAR



Tết is the most important holiday in Vietnam, marking the arrival of the Lunar New Year and the beginning of spring. It's a time for family reunions, paying respects to ancestors, and feasting on traditional foods.

(The biggest and longest public holiday)

Late January - early February (date varies according to the lunar calendar)

NGÀY THỐNG NHẤT REUNIFICATION DAY



This day commemorates the fall of Saigon in 1975 and the reunification of North and South Vietnam. It's a public holiday marked by official ceremonies, parades, and various cultural events.

NGÀY QUỐC KHÁNH VIETNAMESE NATIONAL DAY



This holiday celebrates the Declaration of Independence from French colonial rule in 1945. It is a patriotic holiday with speeches, parades, and celebrations of national pride.

TRADITIONAL & **CULTURAL FESTIVALS**

TÉT TRUNG THU MID-AUTUMN FESTIVAL



Also known as the Moon Festival - features lantern parades, mooncakes, and performances. Thiscelebrates the harvest and the full moon.

September (15th day of the 8th lunar month)

LIM FESTIVAL

This festival is a vibrant event showcasing regional culture, celebrates traditional folk music known as "quan ho" with performances, singing competitions.

TRADITIONAL CUISINES IN VIETNAM

Vietnam's culinary landscape is incredibly diverse, with each region offering its own distinct flavors and specialties. Here's a guide to some famous local foods from north to south:



Banh Mi in Vietnam is famous around the world for its distinctive flavors. The Vietnamese baguette sandwich is a fusion of French and Vietnamese flavors, featuring a crispy baguette filled with meats like pork, pâté, pickled vegetables, and fresh herbs.

NORTHERN VIETNAM

- Phö: Iconic noodle soup with beef or chicken, herbs, and spices, served with fresh herbs, lime, and chili.
- Bún Chả: Hanoi dish of grilled pork with rice noodles and dipping sauce, accompanied by herbs and pickled veggies.
- Gôi Cuốn: Fresh spring rolls made with rice paper, often filled with shrimp, pork, herbs, and noodles.
 - Chả Cá: Marinated fish cooked with turmeric and dill, served with noodles and herbs.
 - Bánh cuốn: Steamed rice rolls filled with ground pork, mush-rooms, and sometimes dried shrimp.











CENTRAL VIETNAM

- Bun Bò Huế: Spicy beef noodle soup from Hue with a rich lemongrass beef broth, pork, and beef shank.
- Cao L\u00e3u: Hoi An dish with thick noodles, crispy pork, fresh herbs, and sprouts, known for its unique texture.
- Bánh Xèo: Crispy pancakes filled with pork, shrimp, and bean sprouts, served with herbs and dipping sauce.
- Bánh Bèo: Steamed rice cakes topped with shrimp, scallions, and crispy shallots, served with fish sauce.









SOUTHERN VIETNAM

- Hů Tiếu: Noodle soup with a clear broth, usually made with pork, seafood, or both, served with fresh herbs and vegetables.
- Goi Đu Đủ: Green papaya salad with shrimp, pork, peanuts, and tangy fish sauce, often spiced with chili.
- Cơm Tẩm: Broken rice with grilled pork, pickled vegetables, and a fried egg, served with fish sauce.



FAMOUS GOLF COURSES

KINGS ISLAND GOLF RESORT (HANOI)

Designed by Jack Nicklaus. It is located about 50 kilometers from Hanoi, making it relatively accessible for golfers in the capital.

BRG LEGEND HILL GOLF RESORT (HANOI)

Designed by Jack Nicklaus II, the course is situated approximately 20 kilometers from Hanoi, making it fairly close to the city.

TAN SON NHAT GOLF COURSE (HO CHI MINH CITY)

Designed by Ronald Fream, this course is situated near Tan Son Nhat International Airport, within Ho Chi Minh City.

MONTGOMERIE LINKS VIETNAM (DA NANG)

Designed by Colin Montgomerie, this course is located approximately 10 kilometers from Da Nang city center.

DANANG GOLF CLUB (DA NANG)

Designed by Greg Norman, the course is situated about 15 kilometers from Da Nang, providing easy access to the city.

BA NA HILLS GOLF CLUB (DA NANG)

Designed by Luke Donald, this course is located around 25 kilometers from Da Nang, nestled in the scenic Ba Na Hills area.

THE BLUFFS HO TRAM STRIP (HO TRAM)

Designed by Greg Norman, it is located about 120 kilometers from Ho Chi Minh City, making it a bit further out.

VINPEARL GOLF CLUB (NHA TRANG)

Designed by Nelson & Haworth, it is situated on the Vinpearl Island, which is accessible from Nha Trang via a short boat ride or cable car.

CAVES AND WATERFALL

Quảng Bình is famous for its stunning caves, including the world-renowned Sơn Đoòng Cave. Below is an overview of the distances from Quảng Bình to Hanoi and Da Nang, along with transportation options:

Hanoi - Quang Binh: 500 kilometers (By train/plane)

Da Nang - Quang Binh: 250 Kilometer (By train/plane)



PHONG NHA

Ilt was the first cave discovered in the Phong Nha area and is a UNESCO World Heritage site, known for its accessibility and beauty.



PARADISE CAVE

One of the longest and deepest caves in Vietnam, featuring spectacular stalactites and stalagmites.



HANG EN

One of the world's largest caves, known for its massive size, river system, stunning scenery, often visited en route to Sơn Đoòng Cave.



SON DOONG

The world's largest cave by volume, featuring a massive chamber, unique ecosystem, and weather system, renowned for its extraordinary scale and biological discoveries.



NGUOM NGAO CAVE

The Ngườm Ngao cave system has some of the most unique stalactite formations in Southeast Asia.



BAN GIOC WATERFALL

Ban Gioc Waterfall, 335 km from Hanoi on the China-Vietnam border, is the world's fourth largest. It was named a top waterfall by Travel+Leisure in 2021 and one of the most beautiful natural borders by SCMP in 2023.



DRAY NUR WATERFALL

Dray Nur is one of the most spectacular waterfalls in the Central Highlands. It features a wide, dramatic drop and a scenic setting with rich vegetation and a large pool at its


AMANOI RESORT NINH THUAN


CENTRAL SECTOR OF IMPERIAL CITADEL OF THANG LONG

Built in the 11th century by the Ly dynasty (recognized in 2010)



HA LONG BAY CAT BA ARCHIPELAGO

Ha Long Bay features more than 1600 karst limestone pillars and isles (Recognized in 1994).



MY SON SANCTUARY

Mỹ Sơn is a cluster of abandoned and partially ruined Hindu temples, constructed between the 4th and the 13th century by the kings of Champa (recognized in 1999)



COMPLEX OF HUE MONUMENTS

the site is well-preserved and remains a remarkable construction of the 19th century (recognized in 1993)



HOLAN ANCIENT TOWN

Hoi An architecture reflects a blend of indigenous and foreign influences from Chinese, Japanese and European cultures. It is an example of a Southeast Asian trading port dating from the 15th to the 19th century (recognized in 1999)



PHONG NHA -KE BANG NATIONAL PARK

Phong Nha – Ke Bang has a diverse limestone karst ecosystem, containing terrestrial and aquatic habitats, forests, savanna, and large caves. The Sơn Đoòng Cave is considered to have the world's largest natural cave passage (Recognized in 2003)



TRANG AN LANDSCAPE COMPLEX

a scenic area located at the southern margin of the Red River Delta. It contains limestone karst peaks with valleys. There are archaeological traces of human activity for more than 30,000 years, dating back from the Neolithic and Bronze Ages. Hoa Lu was the ancient capital of Vietnam, established in the 10th and 11th centuries (Recognized in 2016).

TRAVEL TIPS MOVING AROUND



MOTORBIKES / SCOOTERS

A popular way to get around in cities like Ho Chi Minh City and Hanoi. Rent for convenience, but wear a helmet and follow traffic rules. If unsure about riding, hire a local driver.



Widely available in cities. In Ho Chi Minh City, use companies like Mai Linh or Vinasun. Ensure the meter is on or agree on a price before starting.





RIDE-SHARING APPS

Grab and Be are widely used in Vietnam. They offer convenient options for both taxis and motorbikes, and they can be a safer choice for getting around.

BUSES

Cities have local buses, and long-distance buses connect cities. They're affordable but can be crowded and less comfortable for long trips.





TRAINS

The Reunification Express and other trains connect major cities, offering scenic routes. For comfort, choose a sleeper cabin.

FLIGHTS

For long distances, flying is the fastest option. Major airlines like Vietnam Airlines, VietJet Air, and Bamboo Airways operate domestic flights. Book in advance to get better rates





Metro systems in Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City are under construction to reduce traffic and modernize transport. In Vietnam, all vehicles drive on the right-hand side.

HOW TO CROSS THE ROAD IN VIETNAM

Especially in cities like Hanoi or Ho Chi Minh City, can feel like an extreme sport! Here's a funny guide to help you navigate the sea of motorbikes:

ASK FOR HELP

Vietnamese people are friendly and happy to assist. You can follow locals or ask a guide to help you cross the road.

3 COMMIT TO CROSSING

Once you step out, keep going. Don't stop or turn back, as this can be more dangerous than continuing forward.

5 WATCH FOR BUSES AND CARS

These vehicles are larger and faster than scooters and may not stop, so avoid crossing in front of them.

ZIGNORE THE HONKING

In Vietnam, honking doesn't always mean danger; it's often just communication, so don't let it throw you off.

9 STAY ALERT

Even on the sidewalk, be cautious. Drivers may use the curb to bypass traffic. Green lights don't always mean traffic will stop, so stay aware.

2 ASSESS THE TRAFFIC

Take a moment to observe the traffic flow and check for cars or buses. Once it's somewhat clear, start crossing.

WALK STEADILY

Move at a consistent, brisk pace. Traffic will flow around you as long as you maintain your speed and direction.

6 RAISE YOUR ARM

Holding your arm up makes you more visible to drivers, signaling your intent to cross.

8 STAY CALM

Crossing the road in Vietnam can feel intense, but stay calm, breathe, and soon you'll master it like a local.
